## COVID-19 UPDATE: Provincial Government Renter Subsidy Application Open Today

The [provincial government](#) opened the renter subsidy application process today and clarified eligibility, answering a number of questions UDI had submitted from members.

As renters (and any applicable roommates) must **first apply** for the subsidy paid directly to rental providers, UDI encourages its members to make this information available to tenants. The instructions, including the BC Housing [application portal](#) link, are included.

### Program Highlights:

- Subsidy is available April, May and June 2020.
- \$300 per month for eligible households with no dependents
- \$500 per month for eligible households with dependents.  
*Eligible roommates may each apply for the supplement.*

### Tenant Eligibility:

- Receiving or eligible for Employment Insurance, the Canada Emergency Response Benefit or experiencing a 25% reduction in monthly employment income as a result of COVID-19;
- 2019 household income of less than \$74,150 for households with no dependents and \$113,040 for households with dependents;
- Paying more than 30% of current/reduced gross monthly income towards rent; and
- Not receiving any other rent subsidy from any level of government, including subsidized housing or rent supplements, such as Shelter Aid for Elderly Renters (SAFER) or Rental Assistance Program (RAP).
- Eligible renters who already paid their April rent are still able to receive the rental supplement for this month.
- Subsidy is paid directly to landlords by direct deposit **within approximately seven days after application is processed**. Additional staff are in place to help.

### TENANT INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1 See if you are eligible.
- 2 Tell your landlord you are applying and get their email address.
- 3 Send your landlord the Landlord Factsheet, and let them know they need to submit the landlord application after you are done with the tenant application.
- 4 Gather all of the information you need to apply in digital format (PDF, TIFF, JPG, JPEG, and PNG).
  - Proof of address
  - Proof of monthly rent amount
  - Landlord's details and contact information
  - For every household member who is age 19 or older:
    - Identification
    - Proof of 2019 income
    - Proof of 2020 income loss related to COVID-19
- 5 Complete the Tenant Application online.
- 6 Landlord gets email from BC Housing with a link to the landlord application.
- 7 Landlord completes landlord application online.
- 8 Tenant and landlord get confirmation email from BC Housing.
